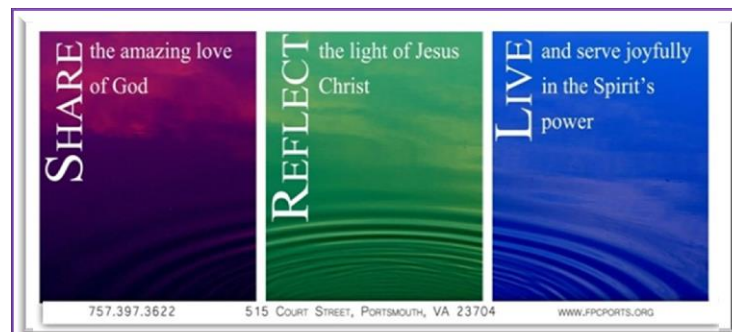

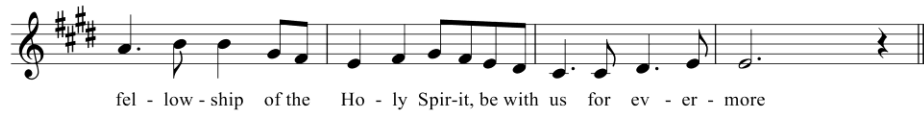

Wanted: Kairos Cookies

The mission of the Kairos Prison Ministry is to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to impact the hearts and lives of incarcerated men, women and youth, as well as their families, to become loving and productive citizens of their communities.

Kairos Inside addresses the spiritual needs of prisoners. Kairos volunteers go into prisons in teams of 30 to 40 to pray, share the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, and share meals and fellowship with the incarcerated on a one-to-one basis.

The first visit is a 3-1/2 day weekend conducted in an institution by a team of volunteers of the same gender as the institution. The weekend begins on Thursday evening and ends with a spirit-filled closing on Sunday. This is only the "starting point" as the participants are guided through steps of understanding the Christian life.

Cookies, baked with prayer, are a significant tool used during a Kairos Weekend. The cookies are a tangible expression of Christian love and an indication of God's concern for a group of people who seldom encounter either in the course of their daily lives. Your loving sacrifice will provide "bread" that shines the light of God's grace into the darkest corners of a prison unit. Approximately 5,000 dozen cookies are needed for the next Kairos Weekend.

Cookies do not need to be made entirely from scratch. Pre-made cookie dough may be used as long as you include the most important ingredient – Prayer!

If you would like to make some cookies, please see the cookie guidelines on the reverse of this insert. **Please place all cookies in the FPC freezer on or before Sun., Mar. 6.**

Cookie Guidelines

Cookie Preparation – These types of cookies that are generally acceptable are: oatmeal, peanut butter, molasses, chocolate chip, ginger and sugar. Cookies should be between 2” and 2 ½” in diameter and not more than ½” thick. ***It is very important not to use icing, sugar, or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookie. Do not add any kind of fruit or nuts to the cookies.***

The Key Ingredient – Prayer – **Pray** individually or as a family over the ingredients before and during the mixing. **Pray** over the cookies as you drop them onto the cookie sheets and bake them. Ask God to use your cookies as a source of His love to shine on the prisoners and staff on the Kairos weekend. **Pray** that each cookie brings the inmate, officer or warden who eats it closer to God. We want every person to become part of the family of God.

Packing Cookies – Bag thoroughly cooled cookies in a quart-sized zip-lock bag, a dozen cookies to a bag. Label each bag with the cookie type. Freeze all cookies if not delivering to FPC within 3 days.

Short Cut – Buy Nestle’s Ready Mix Chocolate Chip Cookie Mix in the half gallon size. This will make about 13 dozen 2 ½” cookies!

Delivery Deadline - Place the cookies in the FPC freezer on or before Sunday, March 6. Put your name, type of cookies, and number of dozens on a note with your cookies.
