First Presbyterian Church Portsmouth Announcements

"Advent" has its origin in Medieval Latin and means "arrival." The circular wreath made of evergreen boughs represents eternity. One candle is lit each Advent Sunday and represents our spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ.

The First Candle is called the Prophecy Candle in remembrance of the prophets who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents **hope** or expectation in anticipation of the coming of the Messiah.

The Second Candle is often referred to as the Angels' Candle and represents **peace**.

The Third (Pink) Candle is customarily called the Shepherds' Candle, and it represents **joy**.

The Fourth Candle represents **love**, and some call this the Bethlehem candle. It symbolizes Christ's birth and being laid in a manger.

The Christmas Eve (White) Candle at the center of the Advent wreath is called the **Christ Candle** and represents the life of Christ that has come into the world.

Overflowing baskets for a large family Christmas dinner were delivered on Tuesday, December 11. Our church family donated the items including a Christmas tablecloth, napkins, plates, cups, and candy canes. A large turkey and ham were added by the church. It was a blessing to be able to do this for a special EDMARC family.
